DEEP FREEZE AT GSU

JOHN EASTMAN reports from Hantack House that things were really cold around GSU. Some statistics:

The coldest temperature was reported at 7:30 a.m., Sunday, January 10, -22°. The lowest wind chill factor was recorded at 4 p.m. the same day, -72°; the highest wind speed, at 4 p.m. (an unbearable 36 MPH) and a -14° temperature were contributing factors to that nose-nipping chill. WATCH BOIL-OVER

The right way is the way athletes, acrobats and paratroopers have been trained to fall. Don't resist. Instead, relax, go limp, and try to roll as you land, easing yourself down with bent arms.

If you have a boil-over or drain your coolant in the spring, or if you have had to add antifreeze in the wake of this bitter cold weather, don't let the liquid stand around on the ground. Drain it into a can and dispose of it properly or cover spills with sand, dirt or lots of snow.
