Repairs Start on Parking Lots

Joseph Gabrisko, facilities manager of Physical Plant Operations alerts all University staff, students, and visitors to the temporary disruption of parking facilities due to the upcoming repairs to the University lots.

Weather permitting, repairs were scheduled to begin this week in "D" lot and the "C" lot annex and proceed eastward until all lots are finished. Time involved for completion is estimated at approximately one week per lot. Construction should be finished by Friday, August 13.

Gabrisko adds that barricades will be positioned at the entrances to the various lots undergoing repairs and must be honored. All traffic regulations will be enforced. He requests cooperation and patience for the duration of the repair work.
