UNIVERSITY ASSEMBLY...Thursday's meeting (November 18) of the Assembly dealt with formation of the standing committees, veto power of the President, a policy for inviting speakers to GSU; and the problem of transportation for commuting students.

STANDING COMMITTEES...The Executive Committee of the Assembly will announce shortly the composition of the standing committees. Committees will be formed on the basis of preferences expressed on the questionnaire passed out last week. It was agreed to hold committees open for additional members for those students who may not have gotten the questionnaire or had an opportunity to respond.

...Bill Engbretson suggested that one defect in the Assembly Constitution is that it does not provide a mechanism for overriding any possible veto by the President. The matter was referred to the Committee on Governance for action. ...in other matters the Assembly adopted an interim policy for off-campus speakers while the Student Services Committee and the Human Services Committee of the Assembly begin work on formulating proposed permanent policy...and transportation for students using buses and trains to come to GSU remains a thorny problem for the University and occupied the bulk of the Assembly discussion Thursday. Student Services will gather information and present the options available at the next Assembly meeting.

UNIDOS...Manny Chavez (BPS) was invited by the Puerto Rican and Mexican Communities to participate in the "Spanish-Speaking Coalition Conference" as a conferee and workshop participant. The conference was held in Arlington, Virginia across the Potomac River from Washington, D.C. on October 23 & 24. The conference was an historic first for the nation's Spanish-speaking community. Its theme was "Unidos" or unity. This conference was viewed as a first step toward nation-wide unity to focus intensive national attention on needs unique to our Spanish-speaking citizens.
