IC STATION...Architects plans for the proposed railroad commuter station in Park Forest South at the edge of the GSU cam-pus were criticized last week by the trustees of the Chicago South Suburban Mass Transit District. The IC proposed a dinky little ground level station with a raised wooden nlatform. The IC claimed that this would be a "light" use station which was challenged by Robert Durkee, Chairman of the District, noting that Park Forest South's projected population is 100,000, Governors State University will be located there to serve the entire south suburban area, and a medical center will draw thousands. Durkee suggested that before the design is finalized the District meet with the IC, the developers and elected officials of Park Forest South, and representatives of Governors State University.

MAME CHANGE...GSU might find itself located in "Mathan" Illinois. The University isn't moving but the village may change its name. The village trustees of Park Forest South took a first step in renaming their village Nathan by passing a resolution authorizing the village clerk to make a formal filing of the name with the Illinois Secretary of State If the name is approved by the Secretary of State, the village will hold hearings on the proposed change. The name honors the memory of the late Hathan Manilow, former president of Park Forest South Developers, Inc.. A total of 508 residents of Park Forest South indicated they approved of the name "Nathan" while 456 said they wanted to retain the name of Park Forest South.

CYBERMETIC VIDEO...The ICC is hosting a week long experience in cybernetic video systems, February 14-18. Consultants from Ecology Tool and Toy of Milford, New Hampshire will conduct workshops and meet with two modules: the Dynamics of Television and a Proseminar in Communication Science.
