BOWLERS WIN CHAMPIONSHIP -- To a list of celebrated women athletes such as Mary Lou Retton, Martina Navratilova and Nancy Lopez GSUers can now enthusiastically add the names Arlene Hylander, BO, Gwen Siebert, SD, and Ellen Zalewski, BO. These three athletes, bowling under the sponsorship of the Governors State University Foundation, recently won the 1985 Ladies League championship at Lakewood Bowl in Richton Park.

Foundation sponsors threatened reprisals. Representing the Board, Bill Dodd, UA, wondered whether the Foundation could afford to continue sponsorship of "losers." The ladies responded valiantly. They did, however, draw the line at Dodd's plan to inaugurate rigorous training procedures which included a daily five-mile run.

Resplendent in their stunning black and white jerseys, the GSU Foundation team rallied to take first place in the latter half of the season, and on April 25 defeated the first-half winners in a tense and dramatic match (Gwen, team hypnotist, had insisted on a second-half marked by a subliminally positive mental attitude).

AREA REFERENCE HOTLINE BASED AT GSU -- The first reference hotline available to Chicago area videotex users is based in the library of Governors State University. The new service titled, "In the Know," enables KEYFAX subscribers to receive answers to their reference questions right on a home or office terminal. KEYFAX is only one of the videotex information services offered by Keycom Electronic Publishing. Additional data bases include an electronic newspaper, the latest available stock quotations, weather maps and the Official Airlines Guide.

Subscribers may also use the system for such business transactions as making airplane reservations, shopping and sending electronic mail to others on the system.

Dr. Melvyn Muchnik, special assistant to the president for new communications technology at Governors State, said service might also be expanded to provide subscribers with lists of events, conferences and workshops available from the university for citizens of the area.
