CHICAGO ARTISTS PARTICIPATE IN FESTIVAL OF THE ARTS. . .

Six well-known Chicago artists will participate in the invitational exhibit of *Works on and of Paper* during the first Festival of the Arts at the university on Sept. 26-28. The artists will show etchings, woodcuts, collagraphs, and other artforms produced on special papers and objects made of paper.

The Festival of the Arts is being held in conjunction with National Arts Week and the twentieth anniversary of the National Endowment for the Arts.

CONTEMPORARY COMPOSERS FEATURED AT FESTIVAL. . .

The works of five contemporary composers will be featured at an outdoor concert of electronic music Sept. 26 at 7:30 p.m. as part of the Festival of the Arts at the university. **Dr. Richard McCreary (CAS)** is coordinator of the event. The concert will be in the Amphitheatre on the north side of the university. There is no admission fee for the avant-garde music concert.

ARTIST MARY MISS RETURNS TO UNIVERSITY. . .

Mary Miss, creator of the 3.7 acre environmental sculpture, *Field Rotation*, in Nathan Manilow Sculpture Park will return to the campus on Sept. 27. In conjunction with the Festival of the Arts, she will deliver a lecture from the site of her world-famous work.

Miss spent the summer of 1981 in University Park working with a crew of more than 20 people to build *Field Rotation*. The huge work has been featured in various art magazines with national and international circulation.

HONOR MUSIC STUDENTS DISPLAY TALENT. . .

As part of the Festival of the Arts, honor music students will perform in the Music Recital Hall at 4 p.m. on Sept. 27. The program is presented by seven students, all from the southern suburbs.

UNIVERSITY STRING QUARTET PERFORMS AT FESTIVAL. . .

The GSU String Quartet will perform in a recital on Sept. 27 at 6:15 p.m. on the lawn near the entrance to the Music Recital Hall. Its appearance will be in conjunction with the reception for Canadian sculptor **Jeffrey Rubinoff**, whose one man show of steel sculptures is opening the same weekend. The musicians will be seated among nine cor-ten steel outdoor sculptures.

MUSIC RECITAL FEATURES LOCAL TALENT. . .

A Community Invitational Music Recital featuring six local people will perform on Sept. 28 at 4 p.m. as part of the Festival of the Arts at the university. One of the artists is **Robert O. Jaynes (UR)** who will sing selections for tenor by Mozart, Schumann, Beethoven, and Campbell-Tipton.

MUSIC FACULTY PERFORM IN RECITAL. . .

Six members of the university faculty will appear in recital Sept. 26 at 4 p.m. as part of the Festival of the Arts. The performance will take place in the Music Recital Hall. Among the musicians are **Donald Kramer**, adjunct faculty member specializing on the clarinet followed by **Karen Blunk**, adjunct faculty member in voice. **Dr. Burgess Gardner (CAS)**, director of the GSU Jazz Ensemble, will play a three movement piece for the trumpet. **Dr. Rudolf Strukoff (CAS)**, director of the GSU Community Chorale, will sing works of Gretchaninoff, Verdi, and Beethoven. **Marilyn Bourgeois**, adjunct professor of piano, will perform Brahms' *Piano Quartet in C Minor* with ensemble. **Michael Boo**, adjunct faculty member on the marimba, will be assisted by graduate student **Larry Zak** as they perform their composition, *Illusions of Perception*.

PEACE RIBBON DECORATES HALL OF GOVERNORS. . .

On opening night of the Festival of the Arts, the Hall of Governors will be decorated from top to bottom and side to side with hundreds of home made banners from the Peace Ribbon. The banners, created mostly by Illinois folk artists, are part of the 15 mile long ribbon which encircled the Pentagon, Capitol Building, Ellipse, and points between on Aug. 4. The exhibit starts at 7 p.m. on Sept. 26.
