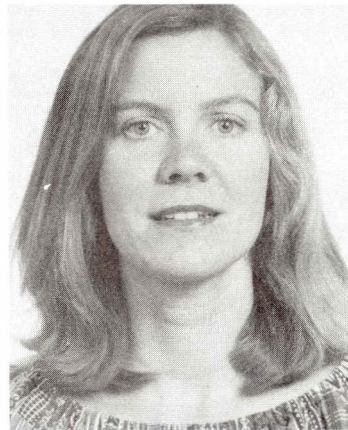

REN SKILL ASSESSMENT LOCATIONS... The Regional Employment Network at Governors State will offer skill assessments at three area locations in June. Unemployed and underemployed workers may have their skill levels assessed at St. Thaddeus Church, 9540 S. Harvard St. in Chicago, from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. on June 9 and 10; at the Cathedral of St. Raymond, 604 N. Raynor St. in Joliet, from 1 to 8 p.m. on June 11 and at Wesley United Methodist Church, 15020 Robey Road in Harvey, from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. on June 11, 16 and 18.

The network is a pilot program which attempts to assess the skill levels of unemployed and underemployed persons and then to compile a data bank which is made available to prospective employers. For further information contact the REN office at extension 2557.

APPLE SAUCE LOAF—GOOD PICNIC FARE...This delicious apple sauce loaf recipe from **Elaine Sherman** (UA) tempted many of her fellow workers off their diets:

1/2 cup butter
 1 cup sugar
 1 egg (well-beaten)
 1 cup dates (fine-sliced) optional
 1 1/2 cups apple sauce
 1 cup coarsely chopped nuts
 1 cup raisins
 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
 1/2 tsp. cloves
 1 tsp. vanilla
 2 cups flour
 2 tsp. soda

Cream butter and sugar. Add well-beaten egg and the vanilla. Then add rest of ingredients. Turn into well-buttered loaf pan and bake one hour in a 350 degree oven.

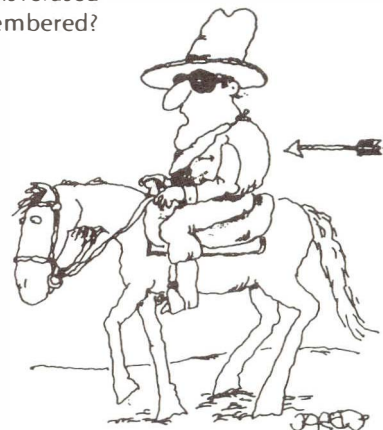
THE LIGHTER SIDE
