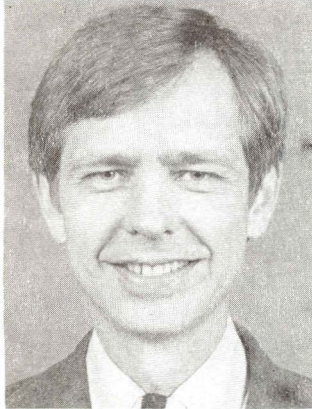

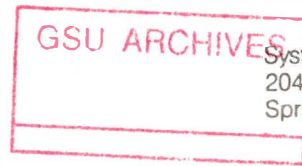

## NOTES

NOTES FROM THE JUNE 1986 BOARD MEETING

Board Elects Officers--Nancy H. Froelich (Lake Bloomington) was unanimously elected to a two-year term as Chairman of the Board of Governors of State Colleges and Universities (BOG). Froelich has served on the Board since 1977. Froelich succeeds Evelyn Kaufman (LaSalle) as Chairman of the Board.

In a statement she made at the Board meeting prior to the Board elections, Mrs. Kaufman thanked the Board for the "wonderful experience" of having served as Chair. She indicated that it was time for new ideas to complement programs initiated during her tenure, in order that the health and vitality of the BOG System be strengthened and continued.

James L. Althoff (McHenry) was elected Vice Chairman. He has served on the Board since 1979. D. Ray Wilson (Elgin) was elected to the Board's Executive Committee and Wilma J. Sutton (Hyde Park area of Chicago) was elected member pro-tem of that committee.

The Executive Committee is a standing committee of the Board that is called upon in the interim between regular meetings to deal with emergency or urgent matters that require Board action.

In addition, William E. Hoffee (Fairfield) was re-elected as the System representative to the State Universities Civil Service Merit Board and Robert J. Ruiz (Chicago) was re-elected as System representative to the State Universities Retirement System.

Fiscal Year 1987 (FY87) Salary Guidelines Approved--Chancellor Thomas D. Layzell recommended and the Board approved guidelines for salary increases for the System's non-negotiated employees. At this time, the FY87 appropriation bill contains sufficient funds to grant an average salary increase of 6.5 percent. The Board authorized the Chancellor and Presidents to adjust the salary increase guidelines if the final appropriation provides salary increase funds at a level other than 6.5 percent.

Board Approves Acquisition of Computing Network--The Board approved the purchase of the Educational Computer Network (ECN) effective July 1, 1986. Under the guidelines approved at the meeting, the BOG will purchase the ECN from the Illinois Educational Consortium, which has operated it on a cooperative basis for the Board of Governors, Board of Regents and Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (SIU-E). The Illinois Board of Higher Education (IBHE) has recommended an operating budget of \$1,221,800 for the ECN in FY87. The ECN computer and its staff are currently located at SIU-E, but will be moved to Governors State University, University Park by the end of Fiscal Year 1988 (FY88).

Board Approves Insurance Purchases--Chancellor Layzell recommended and the Board approved the purchase of \$5 million in property insurance coverage with a \$100,000 deductible from the International Insurance Company at a cost of \$350,000. The Board also approved the continuation of an existing policy with Affiliated FM Insurance Company to cover the replacement value of the Board's bond revenue property in excess of \$5 million. The renewal premium of the existing policy was \$101,170.

The Board also received an update on the System's self-insurance program, which was established in January because of the high cost of liability insurance.
