**GSU ARTICLE IN CONGRESSIONAL RECORD...**An article on Governors State and Park Forest South was entered verbatim in the Congressional Record on August 3 on a unanimous consent motion by Speaker Charles Percy. Percy's introductory remarks and the article from the July Journal of Housing begin on Page S12580 of the August 3 Record. Percy said, "The State of Illinois has shown its faith in the Park Forest South concept by locating one of two new universities, Governors State University, in the heart of the community." He then asked unanimous consent to have an article on Park Forest South and the one on GSU titled, "New Town University Tests New Methods" printed in toto.
