AT THE JAN. 15 BOG MEETING...the field of candidates for the presidency at Northeastern University has been narrowed from 110 to approximately 28 applicants...UNI Pres. Jerome Sachs has announced his intention to retire next August 31 after serving as that institution's chief administrative officer for more than 10 years...In deferring any action on a proposed systemwide evaluation policy, the Board requested that each institution provide a summary of its current staff evaluation procedures. It is the intent of the Board to further discuss this issue at its Feb. meeting before taking any action at its March or April meeting...The Council of Faculties raised questions about the Illinois BHE's Lincoln State University proposal. No action was taken by the BOG pending further study of this concept of a statewide "university without walls."

ACCREDITATION EXIT INTERVIEW...transcript has been distributed to all unit heads... the exit interview is a tentative report to the University...the formal written report from the site visit team is expected in late January or February and the status of "recognized candidate" voted upon by the North Central Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges at its annual meeting in March...anyone desiring her/his own copy of the transcript of the exit interview should contact JERRY BAYSORE (ext. 206/207) in the President's Office.

BOG DEGREE APPROVED ...by Illinois Board of Higher Education. This first for Ill. is a program designed primarily for mature adults making it possible to obtain a degree without long attendance at any one campus. Participating in the program are Chicago State, Eastern Illinois, Governors State, Northeastern Illinois and Western Illinois Universities. The program provides for the earning of credit for life and work experience, allowing graduation when only 15 of the total 120 semester credits required have been taken at any one or combination of the five BOG universities...It is expected that many students accepted for this program will utilize heavily non-traditional forms of learning...It will be necessary to have at least 40 semester credits at the jr-sr. level, and at least 12 semester credits in each of the general areas of social sciences, natural sciences, and humanities. The Board of Governors Degree Coordinator at GSU is DIXON BUSH (240).
