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**LUNCHEON NOTES PRESENTS.** . . On June 4 mezzo soprano **Barbara Fagin** will perform with accompanist **Tony Martinez**. **John Chorney** will play the piano on June 11, and on June 18 **Melvin Davis** will sing and perform on the piano. Pianist Tony Martinez will entertain on June 25. All performances of Luncheon Notes begin at 12:30 p.m. in the Hall of Governors. The public is invited to attend these free concerts.

**NEW CONSTRUCTION AT GSU.** . . The long-awaited \$3.4 million project to re clad the exterior steel walls of GSU began Tuesday, May 26. According to **Dr. Virginio Piucci (A&P)**, the utmost attention will be paid to helping students and community residents who use the building. "We're disappointed by the disruption, because we take great pride in how we maintain the GSU facility. In the end, this project should provide an attractive, durable and low maintenance exterior," he said.

Construction will begin in June on the GSU physical plant building. The new building will provide 8,000 square feet to accommodate the needs of the university's crafts and trades employees and will consolidate all repair and maintenance functions under one roof. The 22-foot high building will be constructed directly west of the main building. It will be bricked on three sides matching the new exterior planned for the main campus building. The fourth side will be garage bays opening into a corporation yard—an enclosed area for the university's cars, snow plows, trucks and other vehicles.

The south side of the building will have a passive solar panel to help minimize the cost of heating during the winter months. The interior will be divided for various tasks, with the potential for adding mezzanine space at a later date.

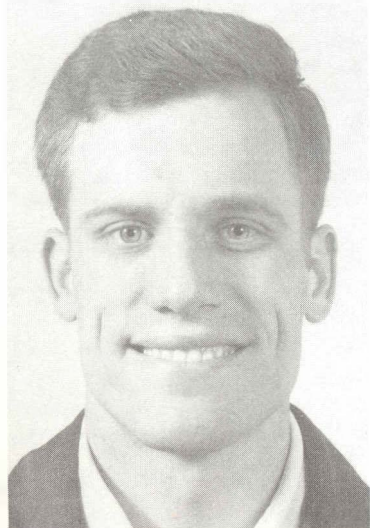
