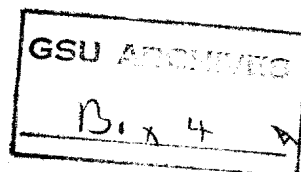

MARY ENDRES...Dr. Mary Endres, Governors State University's University Vice-President, Academic Affairs and University Professor of Early Childhood Education, will become Vice-President Emeritus March 10, 1976, the Illinois Board of Governors of State Colleges and Universities announced June 12 at Springfield.

HOLIDAY REMINDER...The professional staff, Civil Service staff, and student body are reminded that the Fourth of July is an official University holiday. All University facilities will be closed except for necessary operations on Friday, July 4.

Dr. Endres will have served almost four years as GSU's Vice-President and will be taking an early retirement. From 1933 to 1955 she served as teacher and administrator in McDonough and McHenry counties and from 1944 to 1955 as superintendent of schools, first in McHenry county and then in Woodstock, Illinois District 10. From 1955 until 1972 Dr. Endres served on the administrative and teaching staffs of Purdue University, also serving from 1960 to 1964 in Pakistan and Nigeria.

### *University Relations*

Hear Ye! Hear Ye! "UR" Arrives. If you called one of our extensions up here the last few days, your first impression was probably that you'd dialed the wrong number. You were greeted with a "University Relations." As a matter of fact, however, this is our new name, approved by the Administrative Council and by the Board of Governors.

Dr. Endres has won Western Illinois University's Distinguished Alumna award and an award for Distinguished Teaching at Purdue University.

"Communications" had ceased communicating adequately inasmuch as our office is now responsible for the GSU Foundation, private fund raising, and the Alumni Association in addition to the responsibilities associated with the prior name, "Office of Communications."

At GSU she has been active in all academic affairs as well as in community service, including the Park Forest South Joint Planning Committee.

The name "Communications" had also proved a source of some confusion in a University blessed with a Communications program in two different colleges, an Instructional Communications Center, etc. etc. etc. Incidentally, research indicated that 17 universities in Illinois have offices of University Relations.

Some 700 degree candidates will graduate at GSU's fifth commencement, bringing a total number of GSU graduates to 1,750. The 1:30 p.m. ceremony will be for graduates of BPS, CCS, and EAS. Commencement at 4:30 p.m. will be for graduates of HLD and the Board of Governors degree program.

A philosopher and educator from Guatemala, who is a professor at Indiana University, and a Chicago public relations and market consultant will receive the first honorary doctorates to be conferred by GSU. Dr. Hector Neri Castaneda will receive an honorary doctor of humanities degree and Charles A. Davis will receive an honorary doctor of human services degree.
