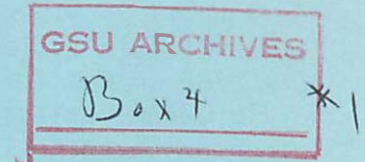

**BHE RELUCTANTLY ALLOCATING...**The BHE has reluctantly agreed to allocating the Governor's budget request for postsecondary education for this year. At its April meeting the Board reaffirmed its feeling that the Board's own Fiscal 1977 Budget recommendations, which were higher than the Governor's, were necessary for adequate funding for higher education in Illinois. Major differences between the two budgets included salary increases, enrollments, and program development. The Board's budget would allow a 7% salary increase, the Governor's budget showed a 2-1/2% increase. The Board would fully fund projected community college enrollment increases, the Governors would fund less than half of the projection. The Governor's budget does not provide funds for program development including health program expansions. It was stated in the BHE's response to the Governor's budget, "There is no question that the Governor's budget is inadequate to meet the needs of higher education in Illinois ....If this trend is permitted to continue, the quality of higher education in Illinois will eventually deteriorate."

**EASTERN ILLINOIS PRESIDENT STEPS DOWN...**Dr. Gilbert C. Fite, President of Eastern Illinois University since 1971, has announced his resignation effective September 1, 1976. Fite, only the fourth President at Eastern since classes began in 1899 said he is leaving to assume the Richard B. Russell Professorship of History at the University of Georgia, Athens. EIU is a member of the Board of Governors of State Colleges and Universities.

**SSAC ELECTIONS...**normally scheduled for the third week of April, have been rescheduled for the week of May 17. Students interested in becoming members of the Student Services Advisory Committee may pick up nomination petitions for this election in Student Services on Monday, April 26, to be returned by Wednesday, May 12. The change was recommended at the April 6 SSAC meeting to avoid conflicts with registration and to give new students a chance to participate.

**POLICY APPROVED...**The policy concerning the Master's Comprehensive Evaluations has now been approved and is effective for all graduate students admitted for the 1976 Spring/Summer Trimester and thereafter. Collegial deans have been requested to submit written plans for implementation of the evaluation for each instructional program by June 1.

A. BOG has a nepotism policy which states: Employees may not serve under the supervision of a relative. Marriages between two staff members, even within the same department will not affect the Civil Service status of either staff member--providing one is not under the supervision of the other.

STATUS REPORT ACCEPTED...The State Teacher Certification Board has accepted the final annual status report on the K-12 Environmental Science Program submitted by GSU. The Board accepted the staff recommendations that the program be granted full approval and no further status reports be required, and commended GSU's efforts over the past two years in conjunction with the (K-12) Environmental Science Program.

PARKING PROBLEMS?...The Department of Public Safety has issued a revised edition of "Motor Vehicle and Parking Regulations" to familiarize GSUers with proper parking procedures. Purpose of the booklet is to "ensure personal safety, maximum use of available facilities and to permit efficient movement of traffic." Copies are available in the Business Office.

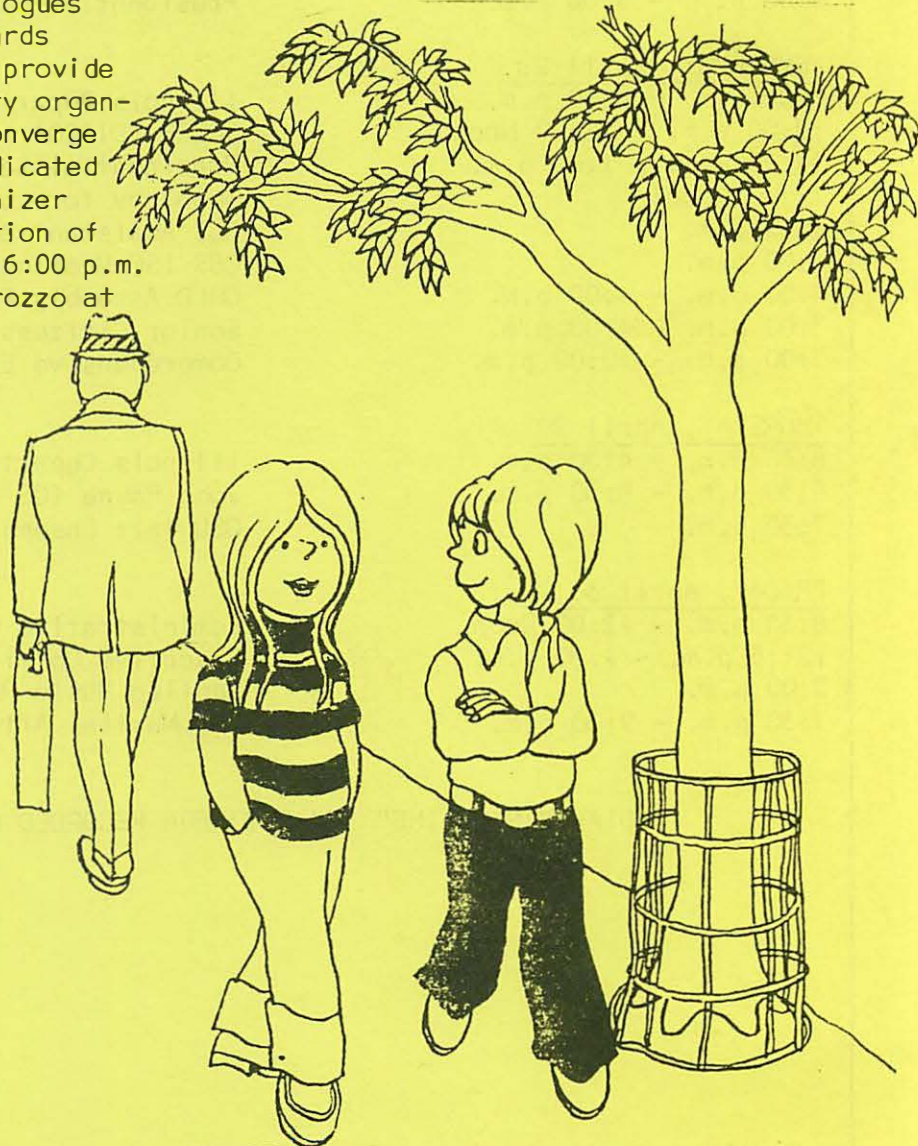
DID YOU KNOW?...A new report by the College Placement Council called "The Hard-to-Place Majority--A National Study of Career Outcomes of Liberal Arts Graduates" shows that, "While liberal arts graduates have more difficulty finding jobs and generally earn less money than graduates of other fields, the majority of liberal arts graduates appear to be satisfied with their careers." The study is based upon data drawn from two college classes which were surveyed as freshmen in 1961 and 1966 and followed up in 1971. Graduates from the earlier class had less difficulty finding a job, show more job satisfaction, and are less likely to want to change jobs than the more recent liberal arts graduates. Both classes, however, tended to view their jobs positively.
