HSA SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS. . . Governors State University has received funding for 50 tuition scholarships, two graduate assistantships and five graduate traineeships in the Health Services Administration Program, to be awarded beginning Jan. 1, 1980. The awards have been made available under the Manpower Training Act through the Department of Health, Education and Welfare and will be given to students enrolled full-time and in good academic standing at the University.
