ARTICULATION CONFERENCE . . . More than 50 counselors and administrators from 15 nearby community colleges were on the Governors State University campus March 18, attending an articulation conference and luncheon. The conferees discussed the current status of--and future plans for--GSU's academic programs and policies, admissions, records, and student development and activities. Speaking at the conference were: GSU President Leo Goodman-Malamuth; Provost Curt McCray; Deans Robert Milam, Clara Anthony, William Katz, and Frank Borelli; Otis Lawrence, John Lowe, Burton Collins, Herbert Robinson, Tommy Dascenzo, M. Catherine Taylor, Tom Deem, and Dick Pride. The conference was hosted by Dick Pride and the Office of Admissions and Tom Deem, Coordinator of Community College Relations.

NEW STUDY UNDERWAY . . . Roberta Bear of HLD and Barbara Purcell of the Provost's Office have received a mini-grant to study aspects of interpersonal relationships. They are interested in interviewing men and women, either divorced or married, as part of their research on the subject. Individual interviews should take approximately one hour and will include questions about psychological aspects of intimate relationships. ATTENTION, FACULTY . . . There will be a workshop for Governors State University faculty on "Assessing Prior Nonacademic Learning,' Thursday, April 10, in Room B-1318, 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Faculty members from other universities and community colleges will also attend. During the all-day workshop, participants will be considering and discussing the aspects of standards and criteria for college credit based on prior learning experiences. Participants will explore three GSU programs: The Board of Governors and University Without Walls Bachelor of Arts Degree Programs, and the CEEL (Credit Through Evaluation of Experiential Learning) Program. Margaret Lee, acting coordinator of the Northeastern Illinois University Board of Governors Bachelor of Arts Degree Program, will be the special consultant for the workshop. Several members of the GSU Office of Assessment staff will present relevant information.

THE GSU STRING QUARTET . . . is performing throughout the Chicago area as part of a five-concert/event series, under the direction of Francois D'Albert, GSU Community Professor of Music. The String Quartet appeared on the University of Illinois-Circle Campus recently and recorded for Vox Records, March 23. The musicians will perform: at Northeastern University on April 10; at the Chicago Public Library on May 4; and at GSU on April 27. They are expected to present another concert at GSU in May.
