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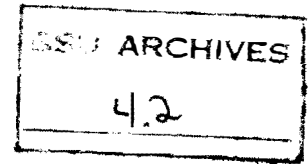

MEMORIAL SERVICE . . . A memorial service for the slain children of Atlanta will be held on April 7 in the Hall of Governors at 4:00 p.m. Tri-colored bows of red, black and green will be distributed one half hour before the service. For more information, phone Mary Taylor, x2165.

GRANTSMANSHIP WORKSHOP . . . A two-day grantsmanship workshop for faculty at historically black colleges and minority faculty at majority institutions will be held April 24-25 at the Radisson Chicago Hotel, 505 N. Michigan Ave. in Chicago. Programs of the three academic Divisions of the National Endowment for the Humanities (fellowships, research and education) will be discussed. Sessions on the Endowment's programs and policies, seminars and individual consultations with NEH staff regarding project ideas will be conducted. Participants will become familiarized with the NEH grant-making processes and have a chance to evaluate applications to the three Divisions. Reimbursements for ground travel expenses, meals and lodging will be provided for all full-time participants. Meals will be provided for part-time participants. Minority faculty and faculty at majority institutions in Illinois in certain areas of study are eligible to participate. The purpose of the conference was to clarify for the community college counselors and administrators GSU's policies, procedures, processes and services that can ensure a community college transfer student's successful transfer and smooth transition to GSU. This was accomplished through a presentation/discussion of the following topics: admission to GSU, including admission requirements, credentials evaluation and the admission process itself; transfer of credit and academic advisement; the University-wide orientation program and student development services such as counseling, testing and the Center for Learning Assistance. 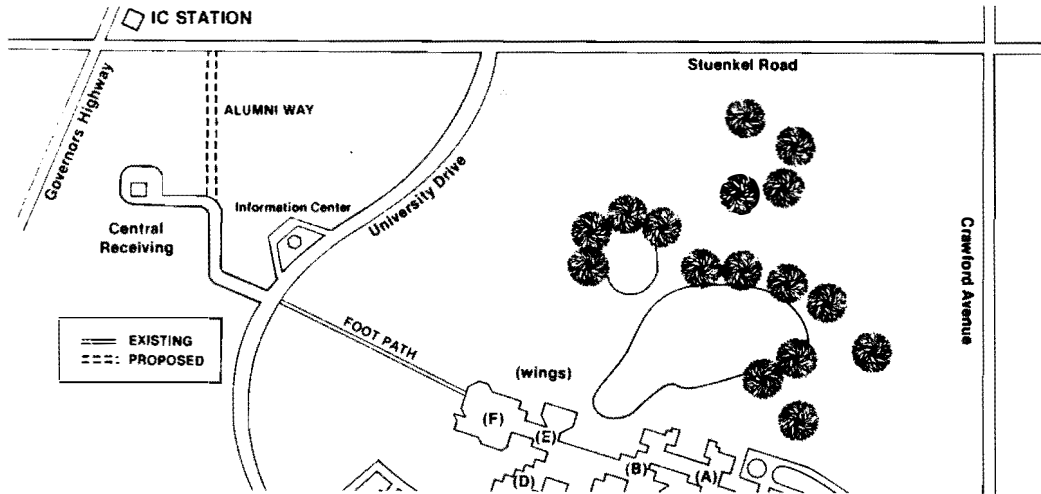

YOU'RE STILL NEEDED . . . The Alumni Association looks forward to having as many volunteers as possible for their 1981 Annual Phonathon. 120 volunteers are needed to give one evening (5:30 p.m. - 9:30 p.m.) of their time April 6-16. Szabo Food Service will donate snacks and partial cost of dinners to be provided for volunteers. Funds collected from this drive will help to achieve two Alumni goals for the University this year: installation of Alumni Way (see map) and purchase of computer terminals for the University Library.



Alumni Way will be a blacktopped, lighted walkway from Stuenkel Rd. to Hantack House for the convenience of ICG commuters. Walking from the University to the train station via Alumni Way will be a much shorter and safer route than competing with traffic on University Drive. GSU Library books and those in 17 other academic libraries throughout the state are now programmed into a single computer system. Patrons of the GSU Library, however, will not have access to this system until GSU terminals are purchased. Once the system is in place, Library patrons will be able to sit down at a terminal, search GSU's holdings for the book they need or search the 17 other libraries and request an interlibrary loan.
